

ILLINOIS 2002 COCA-COLA YOUTH BOWLING CHAMPIONSHIPS STATE RULES and FORMAT

- 1. This tournament is sanctioned by the Young American Bowling Alliance and shall be governed by the rules of the YABA. The tournament sanction number is 56.
- 2. **Participation** in the State Finals is a one-time entry. If an individual qualified and cannot participate in the State competition, replacements will be eligible based on order of finish in the previous Zone competition.

Advancers out of the league level must remain in the division they qualified during all subsequent levels. If a bowler advances out of league level in more than one state/province/zone, the bowler must declare one state/province/zone to continue competing before the next competition level. Participation in any level of competition past the league level in more than one state/province/zone will result in automatic disqualification.

**Bowlers must show MEMBERSHIP CARD when checking in for this tournament.

- 3. <u>ADVANCEMENT RATIO</u>: The advancement ratio from **Zone** competition to **State** competition is at least **one (1) for every seven (7)** entries per division, or major fraction thereof, including last place ties. In all cases, at least two persons per division shall advance to the State Finals. The advancement ratio shall be applied uniformly to all eligible divisions.
- 4. <u>STATE COMPETITION</u> will take place at Pheasant Lanes in Bloomington, Illinois on May 3, 4 and 5, 2002, for ages 12 and over; and on May 18 and 19 for ages 11 and under. Squad times will be ASSIGNED by the State Director. ***State competition will take place in centers serving Coca-Cola products. Only centers serving Coca-Cola products will be eligible to host the State Finals.
- 5. <u>THIS SECTION FOR **ZONE DIRECTORS ONLY:**</u> Zone Directors must submit the names, addresses and telephone number of qualifiers along with the tournament entry fee for all qualifiers to the State Director by February 4, 2002 for the first zone and March 20, 2002 for the second zone. The advancing bowlers will be notified by personal letter from the State Director as to date and squad time.
- 6. Competition shall be conducted in six (6) divisions (based on age as of AUGUST 1, 2001)

Division A	Boys' Handicap – Ages 11 and Under
Division B	Girls' Handicap – Ages 11 and Under
Division C	Girls' Handicap – Ages 12 and Above
Division D	Girls' Scratch – Ages 12 and Above
Division E	Boys' Handicap – Ages 12 and Above
Division F	Boys' Scratch – Ages 12 and Above

7. **FORMAT:** Ages 11 & Under will bowl either May 18th or May 19th bowling three (3) games, staying on the same pair of lanes. The State Director may cancel some squad times if there are not enough bowlers to hold a full squad. Position in standings will be determined by total pins plus handicap. Scholarships for tied positions will be added and divided equally.

AGES 12 & Above will bowl May 3rd or May 4th. Bowlers will bowl two (2) three (3) game blocks, moving after three (3) games. The field will be cut to the top 24 in each division after the six (6) games. Position in standings will be determined by total pins plus handicap, where applicable.

PINS WILL BE DROPPED AFTER SATURDAY!!

The top 24 from each division will bowl Sunday, May 5th, drawing for lanes at the time of check-in. The top 24 will bowl eight (8) games, moving after each game.

Procedure for calling replacements if missing bowlers on Sunday: Replacement names will be called in order of finish, until 24 bowlers are on the lanes, ready to bowl. Names will be called three (3) times, before advancing to the next name.

Upon the completion of eight (8) games, total score plus handicap, where applicable, will determine the top 5 bowlers in each division.

PINS WILL BE DROPPED AGAIN AFTER THE TOP 24 HAVE BOWLED

The top 5 bowlers in each division will then bowl step-ladder finals to determine the bowlers advancing to the International Finals. Example: the 5^{th} place bowler will bowl the fourth place bowler; winner of that match will bowl the 3^{rd} place bowler, etc.

8. ENTRY FEE for all divisions is \$10.00

9. ENTRY CLOSING DATE: APRIL 12, 2002 - Bowlers are required to submit the \$10.00 entry fee along with their INDIVIDUAL RECORD SHEET for the season as of March 28, 2002. ** An individual record (or summary) sheet, NOT standing sheets, must be submitted for each league (including travel leagues) the bowler has bowled in for the 2001-2002 season. Bowlers not submitting all individual record sheets will be DISQUALIFIED.

An AFFIDAVIT form will be mailed to each bowler who, in turn, then must do the following:

- A. Have coaches sign to verify average for all leagues bowled.
- B. Fill in all personal information
- C. Return copy of each league Individual Record Sheet

The Individual Record Sheets as well as the Affidavit and \$10 entry fee must be returned by **APRIL 12, 2002**. DO NOT bring to the tournament. **If all documents and entry fee are not received by April 12th, the bowler will lose their spot.** A telephone call or e-mail to the State Director may be accepted as notification of attendance if documentation will not make the April 12th deadline. Replacements will be called after April 12th to fill the spot.

REMEMBER DO NOT BRING AN INDIVIDUAL RECORD SHEET OR THE AFFIDAVIT AND MONEY TO THE TOURNAMENT. YOU WILL BE TREATED AS A REPLACEMENT IF THE SPOT IS NOT ALREADY FILLED. Bowlers in the first zone window will have an earlier date to confirm holding their spot. Averages can be faxed after the March cutoff date.

10. <u>STATE AVERAGE</u>: Bowlers will use their highest current average, in any league, as of March 28, 2002, with a minimum of nine (9) games. If a bowler does not have nine (9) games, they must present the individual record sheet as required for any league bowled, including travel leagues.

Averages must be verified by a copy of an Individual Record Sheet, thus confirming entrant's attendance at the State Finals, by April 12, 2002. See paragraph 9, above, for all documents that must be mailed to the State Director by that date.

11. **DRESS CODE:** All bowlers must wear suitable attire.

What You CANNOT Wear

- > No sweats, short-shorts, mini-skirts or spandex clothing
- No clothing depicting sex, smoking, or drinking
- > No hats/caps
- > No denim, parachute material, carpenter or cargo pants

What You CAN Wear

- > T-shirts with bowling center name/sponsor name (Saturday Only 12 & Over Divisions)
- Shirts with a "fold-down" collar
- > Dress slacks
- > Girls may wear dress slacks, "walking" shorts, skorts or skirts

Dress Code at the State Finals will be strictly enforced. Coaches are asked to review the dress code for State Finals with bowlers.

- 12. No substitutes will be permitted once the athletes have started tournament play; however, replacements may be used for bowlers not present 30 minutes prior to squad time as stated in Rule #2. Replacements will be called from the zone reports for 2001-2002.
- 13. No smoking or consumption of alcoholic beverages by guests or athletes shall be allowed on the concourse or in the settee area, only in designated areas.
- 14. Competitors shall be allowed five (5) minutes of practice on their starting pair. No practice will be allowed when moving lanes. NOTE: Exception to this rule for the Top 5 Match Game Format. The next advancing bowler may take two (2) practice balls on the set before score is kept. Warm-up lanes are also available for the top 5 bowlers during the match play. Extreme exceptions shall be determined by the tournament director and any committee members present.
- 15. If no replacement has been made, bowlers arriving late shall begin play and the score shall count beginning with the frame then bowled. Frames missed shall be credited with a zero. A bowler not present to bowl when it is his/her turn will be credited with a zero for that frame.
- 16. Handicap shall be 90% of the difference between the bowlers average and 200.
- 17. Only bowlers and tournament officials shall be permitted in the settee area.
- 18. All ties to determine position in standings during any phase of the Ages 12 & Over Divisions Finals, including last-place ties for advancement to the International Finals, will be broken immediately by a one-game roll off. If a tie still exists, it will be broken by a 9th and 10th frame roll-off, plus 1/10 of handicap per frame, where applicable.
- 19. Claims for errors in scoring or general playing rules must be made to the tournament director no later than the start of the next block. Questionable errors shall be decided upon by the tournament director and any committee members present. All other protests must be confirmed in writing to the tournament director within 48 hours. Each protest under this rule must be specific in itself.

Score monitors will ask an adult to help watch for rule errors and to stop play instantly. The Tournament Director will be called, along with committee members present, to make the call on any rulings.

20. Symbolic awards will be given as follows: Plaques will be given to the top 5 (stepladder finals) in the 12 and Over Divisions. Plaques will be given to the top 8 in the 11 and Under Divisions.

Any remaining monies will be awarded on a ratio of 1 to 10, by divisions. Scholarships will be held in the S.M.A.R.T. Program, ATTN: Ed Gocha, 5301 S. 76th, Greendale, WI 53129, telephone number: 414-421-4700.

22. The first place winners of the 12 and above Girls' and Boys' Scratch Divisions will advance to the 2002 USA Junior Gold National Championships July 6-12 in Winter Haven/Lakeland, Florida. They must be Junior Gold Program Members to advance (The advancer must meet the 175 or higher average for males or 165 average or higher for females and have a Gold membership or purchase a Gold membership prior to the championships.) YABA will pay for their \$125 entry fee into the USA Junior Gold Championships. These athletes will then still compete for \$15,000 in scholarships earmarked just for Coca-Cola advancers, plus approximately \$50,000 in scholarships available to all athletes at the championships, as well as other prizes and awards. (No travel reimbursement or stipend will be provided for these athletes by YABA.) However, the Illinois Coca-Cola Tournament

will provide \$500.00 toward travel expenses to the first place winner in each of the Boys' Scratch and Girls' Scratch divisions. All U.S. citizens are vying for a spot on Junior TEAM USA to represent the United States in national and international competition.

The first place winner in each of the 12 and above divisions of the Boys' and Girls' Handicap will advance to the 2002 Coca-Cola Youth Bowling Championships international finals being conducted in Winter Haven, Florida (July dates to be determined.) Advancement to the finals is an expense paid trip for the athlete only, except for finalists representing military commands of the European, Far Eastern and the Caribbean Zones. These finalists are responsible for their traveling expenses to reach the continental United States border. **Airfare arrangements will be provided by Mon Valley Travel and a stipend will be provided to each athlete on site for housing and meal expenses.** Winners are not confirmed as international finalists until they receive a confirmation letter from YABA. Advancers will be required to accompanied by a parent, guardian or coach. The international finals will no longer be providing chaperones.

23. Additional berths to the International Finals will be given as follows:

Two (2) girls' handicap.....sending a total of three (3) to international finals Four (4) boys' handicap.....sending a total of five (5) to international finals

- 24. International entering average will be re-rated if average set at state competition is more than ten (10) pins higher than his/her year-end average. Re-rated averages will be a composite average of that tournament average plus bowler's year-end average added together and divided by two. The average at the state level will be determined by the scratch score of the first six (6) games bowled (not including tiebreakers or step-ladders). Previous National Junior Bowling Championships or Coca-Cola Youth Bowling Championships competition averages will also be used in figuring the entering average at the 2002 International Finals.
- 25. Advancers must agree to bowl in the international finals or, failing to do so, agree to waive all rights. Replacements will be selected based on the order of finish in their division at the state level. Replacements will incur all costs associated with changing the airline ticket, if applicable. If the advancer decides not to attend the international finals, the state scholarship won may be withdrawn. This decision will be made by the State Coca-Cola Tournament Committee, based on the reasons for not attending the international finals.
- 26. All matters not covered by these rules and regulations shall be determined by the Illinois State Coca-Cola Youth Bowling Championship Tournament Committee. Failure to abide by any rules and regulations will lead to disqualification from this event. The Coca-Cola Youth Bowling Championship Tournament Committee reserves the right to accept or deny any participant.
